About the Role

The Climate Specialist will help grow Aguaconsult's work on climate at the global, regional, and country levels by expanding and delivering a pipeline of technically engaging and strategically important assignments. Key functions include:

- Supporting projects (or dedicated components of larger assignments) focused on climate resilience at the global, regional and country levels.
- Contributing to the writing, development and production of knowledge products and other outputs such as position papers, project reports, evaluation reports, concept notes, advisory briefings, and related electronic outputs, including blogs and other web-based products.
- Supporting the business development process (technical and financial proposal development, pro-active acquisition) for projects focused on climate resilience.
- Conducting desk research and interviews with stakeholders and sector experts.
- Conducting and supervising data collection, including field work.
- Analysing and interpreting data collected from surveys (quantitative and qualitative analysis).
- Preparing materials for workshops and webinars and presenting findings.
- Review and quality control of project outputs.
- Representing Aguaconsult in project and external meetings and conferences.
- Mentoring more junior staff, chiefly on a project-basis.

While the role has a core focus on climate, as needed, the successful candidate will contribute to projects on other thematic topics across the company portfolio.

The annual profit-share increases over time with significant uplifts after 4, 7 and 10 years with the company.</i></p>
